**ORDER REFUSING TO ISSUE MOTOR VEHICLE
EXTENDED SERVICE CONTRACT PRODUCER LICENSE**

On October 29, 2012, the Consumer Affairs Division submitted a Petition to the Director alleging cause for refusing to issue a motor vehicle extended service contract producer license to Kevin N. Greenwood. After reviewing the Petition, the Investigative Report, and the entirety of the file, the Director issues the following findings of fact, conclusions of law, and order:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Kevin N. Greenwood ("Greenwood") is a Missouri resident with a residential address of 453 Stonepath Ln., O'Fallon, MO 63366.
2. On or about December 2, 2011, the Department of Insurance, Financial Institutions and Professional Registration ("Department") received Greenwood's Application for Motor Vehicle Extended Service Contract Producer License ("Application").
3. Background Question No. 1 of the Application asks, in relevant part: "Have you ever been convicted of a crime, had a judgement withheld or deferred, or are you currently charged with committing a crime?"
4. Greenwood marked "Yes" to Question No. 1 and in two separate letters attached to his Application stated, in part:

The pending charge I am dealing with is from having a couple of prescription pills in my car without the bottle in which they were prescribed. I did have the prescription at the time and I have a lawyer working on this now.

* * *

The conviction from 2002 took place when I was 17 years old. I was

having a very hard time in my life at that time. My father passed on and I was living on my own. I've learned a very valuable lesson from this experience and feel very fortunate for this happening so early on in my life.

5. On or about October 17, 2002, Greenwood pled guilty to the Class B Felony of Trafficking in the Second Degree in violation of § 195.223.7(1) RSMo (Supp. 2001). The court sentenced Greenwood to ten years in the custody of the Department of Corrections. On April 8, 2003, the court suspended the execution of the ten year sentence and placed Greenwood on probation for a period of five years. *State v. Kevin N. Greenwood*, Lawrence Co. Cir. Ct., No. CR402-454FX.
6. The pending charge referenced by Greenwood in his letter is the Class C Felony of Possession of a Controlled Substance in violation of § 195.202. *State v. Kevin N. Greenwood*, St. Louis Co. Cir. Ct., No. 10SL-CR00727.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

7. Section 385.209 RSMo (Supp. 2011)¹ provides, in part:
 1. The director may suspend, revoke, refuse to issue, or refuse to renew a registration or license under sections 385.200 to 385.220 for any of the following causes, if the applicant or licensee or the applicant's or licensee's subsidiaries or affiliated entities acting on behalf of the applicant or licensee in connection with the applicant's or licensee's motor vehicle extended service contract program has:

* * *

(5) Been convicted of any felony[.]
8. Just as the principal purpose of § 375.141, the insurance producer disciplinary statute, is not to punish licensees or applicants, but to protect the public, *Ballew v. Ainsworth*, 670 S.W.2d 94, 100 (Mo. App. E.D. 1984), the purpose of § 385.209 is not to punish applicants for a motor vehicle extended service contract producer license, but to protect the public.
9. Greenwood may be refused a motor vehicle extended service contract (MVESC) producer license pursuant to § 385.209.1(5) because he has been convicted of a felony. Greenwood pled guilty to the Class B Felony of Trafficking in the Second Degree in violation of § 195.223.7(1) RSMo (Supp. 2001). *State v. Kevin N. Greenwood*, Lawrence Co. Cir. Ct., No. CR402-454FX.
10. Greenwood has been convicted of the Class B Felony of Trafficking in the Second

Degree; this felony is a sufficient ground to refuse Greenwood a MVESC license. Granting Greenwood a MVESC producer license would not be in the interest of the public. For all of the reasons given in this Order, the Director has considered Greenwood's history and all of the circumstances surrounding Greenwood's Application and exercises his discretion to refuse Greenwood's motor vehicle extended service contract producer license.

11. This Order is in the public interest.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that the motor vehicle extended service contract producer license application of **Kevin N. Greenwood** is hereby **REFUSED**.

TO: Applicant and any unnamed persons aggrieved by this Order:


